GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All graduates receive a U.S. high school diploma of international recognition, and all students who meet the requirements earn a Colombian diploma.

- A minimum of 22 credits are needed for the U.S. diploma (18 required and 4 elective).
 Requirements for a Colombian diploma are 6 years of core classes.
- Since 2012, 96% of our students have received both diplomas.
- Every student must complete 120 hours of community service by the end of 12th grade.
- Students must complete at least 2 years at ECA, one being the entire senior year.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT BODY

ECA is a comprehensive 4-year high school with 78 students in grades 9-12.

CURRICULUM

The academic program at ECA is organized on a standard period schedule. The maximum course load is 3.8 credits per semester. Students have eight 45-minute classes daily. The school year has 180 school days starting in early August and finishing early June. Courses range from 0.1 to 0.5 credits per semester, based on the number of periods scheduled per week. Most students take 6 core courses per semester:

Spanish, Social Studies, Science, Math, English, and Bible

The normal course load for 9th - 12th grade is 10 courses per semester.

Honors Classes: We offer honors classes in English, Math, and Spanish.

AP Courses: We offer AP Calculus BC. ECA students consistently score higher than the national average on their AP exams.

<u>Classes in Spanish</u>: Spanish and select Social Studies classes are the only classes taught in Spanish.

GRADING AND RANKING

ECA ranks only 1st and 2nd place due to small class size.

Note: Honors courses are awarded an additional .5 quality point, and AP courses are awarded an additional 1.0 quality point. Transfer credits are not included in the GPA.

STANDARDIZED TESTS

- > **PSAT/SAT** 10th and 11th graders take the PSAT, 11th and 12th graders the SAT.
- > **Pre SABER** Standardized Colombian test given to all 11th graders in the areas of Spanish, Math, and Science
- > **SABER 11 / ICFES** Colombian college entrance exam that all Colombian students take
- > AP Exams Students are guided in studying for AP exams.

- > In the last 5 years, ECA students have scored an average of 88 out of 100 on the English section of the ICFES exam, which reflects our high level of bilingualism.
